

DO I HAVE A "PERSONAL INTEREST" ?

• Where the item relates or is likely to affect your **registered interests** (what you have declared on the formal Register of Interests)

OR

• Where a decision in relation to the item might reasonably be regarded as affecting **your own** well-being or financial position, or that of your **family**, or your **close associates** more than most other people affected by the issue,

you have a personal interest.

WHAT MUST I DO? Declare the existence, and <u>nature</u>, of your interest and stay

- The declaration must relate to specific business being decided a general scattergun approach is not needed
- **Exception** where interest arises only because of your membership of another **public body**, there is no need to declare unless you **speak** on the matter.
- You **can vote** on the matter.

IS IT A "PREJUDICIAL INTEREST" ?

In general only if:-

- It is a personal interest *and*
- The item affects your **financial position** (or conveys other benefits), or the position of your **family, close associates** or bodies through which you have a **registered interest** (or relates to the exercise of **regulatory functions** in relation to these groups)

<u>and</u>

• A member of public, with knowledge of the relevant facts, would reasonably believe the interest was likely to **prejudice** your judgement of the public interest.

WHAT MUST I DO? Declare and Withdraw

BUT you may make representations to the meeting before withdrawing, **if** the public have similar rights (such as the right to speak at Planning Committee).

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

This report presents the findings and recommendations of the Promoting Sporting Participation

There were a number of original aims and objectives of the scrutiny exercise. These included:

- To review what arrangements are currently being made locally and nationally to use the 2012 Olympics to promote sport and raise participation levels and to discuss the possibility of staging local Olympic themed events.
- levels in Redditch in the long term. This could include consulting with participants at any local Olympic themed event that may be staged on what further provision for sporting participation To consider what can be done to ensure that the 2012 Olympics boosts sports participation the Council might provide.
- To review existing provision for sport in Redditch and to identify any existing barriers to participation
- To consider how the link between increased sporting participation and improved health and wellbeing can be further strengthened and promoted in Redditch

It was consequently agreed that this would be a very timely opportunity to undertake a review of how to best promote the considerable benefits that can be accrued through playing locally. For many people, the staging of a Olympic Games in the UK is likely to be a once in a expected increased interest in sport that London's hosting of the 2012 Olympics promises to The Promoting Sporting Participation Review was launched in an attempt to draw upon the sport when public interest is likely to be at its very peak. The recent decline in adult participation rates for sport in town added a greater local significance to recreation, at moderate intensity, for at least 30 minutes on 3 or more days a week. Indeed, figures using the Olympics as a springboard to improve the public's awareness of sporting provision in the Borough. Immediately prior to the review, Redditch possessed the second lowest rate for sporting sport and active recreation. By October 2011, after the start of the review, this figure had declined declined year on year since 2005 according to NI 8 figures which measures adult participation in Redditch for people between the ages of 16 and 54. Adult sporting participation in Redditch had participation in Worcestershire, with fewer than 21% of adults participating in sport and active suggested that there had been an especially sharp decline in sporting participation levels in still further, with less than 1 in 5 adults now playing sport in Redditch on a regular basis.

The Group strongly suggests that a new independent website to promote sport in Redditch should possess its own distinct image and identity if it is to operate successfully and believe that a clear emphasis must be placed on promoting sport in Redditch regardless of the provider. 1. <u>SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS</u>

The report details the outcomes of training that was provided to all Members on the subject of Overview and Scrutiny on Monday 14th May 2012. In particular, the committee is asked to consider the subjects that were proposed by Members during the training as potential items for scrutiny and whether to incorporate these items into the Committee's Work Programme for 2012/13.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

The Committee is asked to RESOLVE

- 1) whether any of the potential scrutiny topics proposed during Overview and Scrutiny training on 14th May (Appendix 1) should be considered further as potential items for scrutiny; and
- 2) that the report be noted.

3. KEY ISSUES

Background

- 3.1 Overview and Scrutiny is a key element of democratic governance arrangements at Redditch Borough Council. To ensure that members of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee can deliver the scrutiny process effectively training is provided annually on the subject of Overview and Scrutiny to elected Members.
- 3.2 This year Overview and Scrutiny training was provided to elected Members on Monday 14th May. The training session provided Members with an introduction to scrutiny, an outline of the Overview and Scrutiny structure in Redditch, and useful information about effective policy review (Task and Finish Group) work. The training was also designed to be interactive and provided elected Members with an opportunity to propose subjects that might potentially be considered by the Overview and Scrutiny Committee or a Task and Finish Group during 2012/13 (Appendix 1).

- 3.3 The Overview and Scrutiny Committee determines the scrutiny Work Programme. Any elected Member, Council Officer, or member of the public can propose an item scrutiny at any time in the year. The Committee is not obliged to launch any reviews that are suggested. However, Members should consider all proposals that are received by the Committee and should provide reasons for any conclusions about proposed reviews.
- 3.4 A number of the topics proposed during the training session would have the potential to form the basis of a Task and Finish review or a Short, Sharp review. In addition, Members may conclude that some of the subjects might be suitable for the Committee to consider at a single meeting.
- 3.5 A scoping document will need to be produced for any items that the Committee considers to be an appropriate subject for a Task and Finish or Short, Sharp Review (Appendix 2). Scoping documents are designed to provide the individual proposing a review with an opportunity to outline the reasons why a review should be launched and the potential terms of reference for a review. The Member who initially proposed a subject would be approached to complete this scoping document though support could be provided by Officers.

Financial Implications

3.6 There are no direct financial implications to this report. However, the Overview and Scrutiny Committee and Task and Finish Groups are obliged to investigate and acknowledge the financial implications of any proposed actions identified during a scrutiny exercise.

Legal Implications

3.7 There are no direct legal implications to this report.

Service / Operational Implications

- 3.8 The Overview and Scrutiny Committee can launch a review of any issue that is impacting on or of interest to the local community. To ensure that reviews are timely and address current community needs the Committee might want to consider how a review of a subject would contribute to the Council's priorities when determining whether a proposed subject would be suitable for scrutiny. Currently, Redditch Borough Council's priorities are that Redditch should be: an enterprising community; clean and green; safe; and underpinning these priorities the Council should aim to be a well managed organisation.
- 3.9 The Committee might also wish to consider the key priorities of the Redditch Local Strategic Partnership, which Redditch Borough Council is committed to addressing. These priorities are: health inequalities; education attainment and

raising the aspirations of young people; developing the economy of Redditch; and tackling areas of deprivation.

- 3.10 In certain circumstances the Overview and Scrutiny Committee may conclude that a proposed subject would not be suitable for scrutiny. For example, topics that have recently been the subject of a review by undertaken by either Councillors or Officers might not be considered appropriate for scrutiny due to the potential to duplicate recent work. Members might also decide not to undertake a review if the proposed review is unlikely to result in constructive outcomes or if the terms of reference that are being proposed are considered to be unrealistic. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee should refrain from reviewing any planning applications or licensing applications as these are subject to separate quasi-judicial processes.
- 3.11 Members may also need to consider available resources when selecting items for scrutiny. This should include considering the availability of elected Members to participate in a review, which usually comprises a maximum of five Councillors. Existing review work should also be considered when determining whether to launch a review. At present, Overview and Scrutiny Members are in the process of completing a review of access for people with disabilities to Redditch town centre and the Committee is committed to launching a review of Redditch market.
- 3.12 In recent years the Overview and Scrutiny Committee has recognised the need to undertake a mixture of lengthy Task and Finish reviews and briefer Short, Sharp reviews at any one time. By undertaking a mixture of review work Members are more likely to be able to balance working demands and to report review outcomes to the Executive Committee at different stages during the year.

Customer / Equalities and Diversity Implications

3.13 One of the key principles of Overview and Scrutiny is to enable the voice and concerns of residents and local communities. Members should therefore consider to what extent each suggested item for scrutiny would meet the needs of local people. Consideration should also be given to the most appropriate forms of consultation that might be required during a review to enable interested stakeholders to contribute to an exercise.

<u>APPENDIX 1</u> Overview and Scrutiny Training Monday 14th May 2012 Suggested Items for Scrutiny

The following items were proposed as possible subjects for scrutiny in 2012/13. For ease of reference these subjects have been listed alphabetically for Members' consideration.

1) Anti-Social Behaviour Review - Monitoring Update Report

Councillor Proposing the item: Councillor Brunner

Summary of proposed Item: Members completed a detailed review of antisocial behaviour in 2006. In line with existing monitoring arrangements the aim of this item would be to provide the Overview and Scrutiny Committee with an opportunity to monitor the implementation of the recommendations that were made on this subject and the long-term impact that these recommended actions have had on services and anti-social behaviour levels in the Borough. Implementation of this proposal would not require the launch of a separate Task and Finish review.

2) Arts Centre

Councillor Proposing the Review: Councillor Brazier

Summary of Proposed Review: The ultimate aim of the review would be to identify whether there is a suitable venue in the Borough that could be utilised as an Arts Centre. The review would focus on the costs involved in establishing an Arts Centre, the potential to access external sources of funding to support the introduction of an Arts Centre and the potential to work with partner organisations to introduce an Arts Centre.

3) Bus Services

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Fisher

Summary of Proposed Review: The review would focus on existing bus service provision, the suitability of current bus services for Redditch residents, and improvements that could be made to meet the needs of Redditch residents.

4) Bus Timetables

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Smith

Summary of Proposed Review: A review of bus timetables in Redditch would be timely following recent changes to bus services within the county and the implications for passengers in Redditch. A review could focus on the impact of changes to bus timetables on residents, how changes to bus timetables are communicated to customers in Redditch, provision of night

services in the Borough, Council influence over bus operators and the impact of competition on the quality of services received by customers (both the positive and negative implications).

5) Child Welfare / Child Protection

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Roger Hill.

Summary of Proposed Review: The review would focus on existing child protection policies in Worcestershire and the suitability of these policies for young people living in Redditch.

6) Crossgates Waste Facility

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Bennett

Summary of Proposed Review: To consider current arrangements for the disposal of waste materials at Crossgates, the potential to utilise a permit system at the site and the implications, if any, for recycling.

7) Dog Fouling

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Smith Summary of Proposed Review: The review would focus on additional actions that could be taken to encourage dog owners to clean up after their pets. Issues that could be considered during the review might include: the potential to distribute "pooh bags" to residents through local shops, the number of dog pooh bins situated in the town and the potential of these bins to meet demand. The Council's enforcement policy in relation to this matter would also need to be addressed.

8) Free Swimming

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Brunner

Summary of Proposed Review: To consider the affordability of the reintroduction of free swimming in the Borough, how many residents from Redditch will be benefiting from the reintroduction of free swimming and the potential impact of visitors from other parts of the country on the costs of providing free swimming arrangements and the quality of services received by Redditch residents.

9) Management of Redditch Trees

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Fisher

Summary of Proposed Review: The review would focus on ongoing maintenance requirements for the many trees situated in Redditch, the Council's criteria for felling trees, the needs of Redditch residents in relation to trees located in the town and how this is reflected in Council

policies, budgets allocated to tree management and landscaping and the cost effectiveness of existing arrangements. Residents would need to be consulted as part of the review.

10) Parking in Residential Areas

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Fry

Summary of Proposed Review: The review would focus on the impact of visitors/staff parking in residential streets and on the availability of parking to residents, particularly in areas where off street parking is currently limited. Civil Parking Enforcement arrangements would be assessed, involving a SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats) analysis of existing enforcement schemes and the potential to implement similar schemes in other parts of the Borough. Local residents and businesses would need to be consulted as part of the review to determine parking needs and preferences.

11) Parking in the Town Centre

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Hopkins

Summary of the Proposed Review: The review would focus on existing car parking provision in the town centre and could involve a SWOT analysis of the impact of charging for parking in the town centre. It is being proposed that if this subject was to be progressed by Overview and Scrutiny it could be undertaken as a Short, Sharp Review.

12) Pathways and Footpaths

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Smith

Summary of the Proposed Review: The condition of footpaths in the Borough is consistently raised by residents as an issue of concern during PACT meetings. A review of the subject could focus on: how to communicate which footpaths are managed by Redditch Borough Council and which are maintained by Worcestershire County Council as well as the use of any budget allocated to footpath maintenance by Redditch Borough Council. The review would also consider the most sustainable and aesthetic materials to use in maintenance of footpaths together with associated costs, (this would involve an analysis of both quality and costs).

N.B It was noted during the meeting that the Climate Change Advisory Panel or Environmental Advisory Panel may have considered this issue in recent years. This will need to be checked and the timeframes verified in order to potentially avoid duplicating recent work.

13) Pavements and Road Re-Surfacing

Councillor Proposing the Review: Councillor Fisher.

Summary of Proposed Review: A review would focus on the existing condition of pavements located in the Borough, current road/pavement surfacing arrangements, the working practices of utility companies and the impact of these practices on road surfaces and any additional maintenance issues.

14) Regeneration in the Town Centre

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Bush

Summary of the Proposed Review: The review would focus on actions that could be taken to re-use and reclassify property and land in the town centre, including Council properties, to regenerate the town centre. The review would take into account actions that are already being taken to address this issue, actions that could be taken to make use of empty shops and office blocks, actions that could be taken to generate income, and the potential to facilitate a café culture in the town.

15) Taxi Vehicles' Road Worthiness

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Bennett

Summary of the Proposed Review: The aim of the review would be to assess the current condition of vehicles licensed to operate as taxis, existing maintenance arrangements, requirements from the licensing authority in relation to the condition of licensed vehicles and any improvements that could be made to enhance the road worthiness of the vehicles.

16) Traffic Islands

Councillor Proposing the Review: Councillor Hopkins

Summary of the Proposed Review: The review would focus on the potential to utilise the many traffic islands based in the town to promote local enterprises and to display sculptures and other art work produced by NEW College students. Ultimately, a review group would be tasked with clarifying the potential for the islands to be utilised to help develop a positive identity for the town.

17) Vehicle Sales on Grass Verges

Councillor Proposing the Subject: Councillor Brunner

Summary of the Proposed Review: The review would focus on the current strategy for tackling sales of vehicles on grass verges, enforcement arrangements, methods utilised to communicate reporting mechanisms to residents, and improvements that could be made communicate

arrangements more effectively. There is the potential that this subject could be considered as a Short, Sharp Review.
