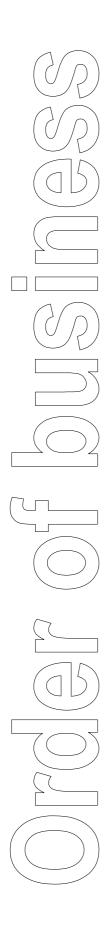

- d) An opportunity will be provided for candidates to speak to their candidature, if desired.
- e) The retiring Mayor will then take a vote on the issue, if necessary.

5.2 Declaration of Acceptance of Office and Investiture - New Mayor

- a) At this juncture the Chief Executive will ask the new Mayor to sign the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.
- b) The retiring Mayor will place the Chain of Office of Mayor on the new Mayor.

(At the same time the Mayoress will pass on her Chain of Office to the successor)

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c) At this point the new Mayor will assume the Mayor's seat on the dais, this having been vacated by Councillor Hall, who will leave the dais and return to his place "on the floor".
