# **Access to Information - Your Rights**

The Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 widened the rights of press and public to attend Authority Local meetings and to see certain documents. Recently the Freedom of Information Act 2000, has further broadened these rights, and limited exemptions under the 1985 Act.

Your main rights are set out below:-

- Automatic right to attend all formal Council and Committee meetings unless the business would disclose confidential or "exempt" information.
- Automatic right to inspect agendas and public reports at least five days before the date of the meeting.
- Automatic right to inspect minutes of the Council and its Committees

- (or summaries of business undertaken in private) for up to six years following a meeting.
- Automatic right to inspect lists of background papers used in the preparation of public reports.
- Access, on request, to the background papers on which reports are based for a period of up to four years from the date of the meeting.
- Access to a public register stating the names and addresses and electoral areas of all Councillors with details of the membership of all Committees etc.

A reasonable number of copies of agendas and reports relating to items to be considered in public must be made available to the public attending meetings of the Council and its, Committees etc.

- Access to a list specifying those powers which the Council has delegated to its Officers indicating also the titles of the Officers concerned.
  - Access to a summary of the rights of the public to attend meetings of the Council and its Committees etc. and to inspect and copy documents.
  - In addition, the public now has a right to be present when the Council determines "Key Decisions" unless the business would disclose confidential or "exempt" information.
  - Unless otherwise stated, most items of business before the <u>Executive</u> <u>Committee</u> are Key Decisions.

## Agenda Papers

The **Agenda List** at the front of the Agenda summarises the issues to be discussed and is followed by the Officers' full supporting **Reports**.

#### Chair

The Chair is responsible for the proper conduct of the meeting. Generally to one side of the Chair is the Committee Support Officer who gives advice on the proper conduct of the meeting and ensures that the debate and the decisions are properly recorded. On the Chair's other side are the relevant Council Officers. The Councillors ("Members") of the Committee occupy the remaining seats around the table.

#### Running Order

Items will normally be taken in the order printed but, in particular circumstances, the Chair may agree to vary the order.

**Refreshments:** tea, coffee and water are normally available at meetings - please serve yourself.

#### **Decisions**

Decisions at the meeting will be taken by the **Councillors** who are the democratically elected representatives. They are advised by **Officers** who are paid professionals and do not have a vote.

#### Members of the Public

Members of the public may, by prior arrangement, speak at meetings of the Council or its Committees. Specific procedures exist for Appeals Hearings or for meetings involving Licence or Planning Applications. For further information on this point, please speak to the Committee Support Officer.

## Special Arrangements

If you have any particular needs, please contact the Committee Support Officer.

Infra-red devices for the hearing impaired are available on request at the meeting. Other facilities may require prior arrangement.

#### Further Information

If you require any further information, please contact the Committee Support Officer (see foot of page opposite).

# **Declaration of Interests: Guidance for Councillors**

## DO I HAVE A "PERSONAL INTEREST" ?

 Where the item relates or is likely to affect your registered interests (what you have declared on the formal Register of Interests)

#### OR

 Where a decision in relation to the item might reasonably be regarded as affecting your own well-being or financial position, or that of your family, or your close associates more than most other people affected by the issue,

you have a personal interest.

### WHAT MUST I DO? Declare the existence, and nature, of your interest and stay

- The declaration must relate to specific business being decided a general scattergun approach is not needed
- Exception where interest arises only because of your membership of another public body, there is no need to declare unless you speak on the matter.
- You can vote on the matter.

## IS IT A "PREJUDICIAL INTEREST"?

In general only if:-

- It is a personal interest <u>and</u>
- The item affects your financial position (or conveys other benefits), or the position of your family, close associates or bodies through which you have a registered interest (or relates to the exercise of regulatory functions in relation to these groups)

#### and

 A member of public, with knowledge of the relevant facts, would reasonably believe the interest was likely to **prejudice** your judgement of the public interest.

#### WHAT MUST I DO? Declare and Withdraw

BUT you may make representations to the meeting before withdrawing, **if** the public have similar rights (such as the right to speak at Planning Committee).

## **COMMITTEE PROTOCOL – LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE**

Each application that comes before this Sub-Committee will be treated on its own merits. This licensing authority will make its decision based on the merits of the application and the promotion of the four licensing objectives, namely:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm,

and will also have regard to the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Redditch Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy.

Members of the Sub-Committee will meet prior to the hearing to note matters to be presented, assisted by the legal and administrative support Officers only. The actual application will not be discussed.

## **LICENSING HEARING PROCEDURE**

### The Hearing

- 1. The Chair will open the meeting, outlining the nature of the decision to be taken, and will identify the members of the Sub-Committee and Council Officers present.
- 2. The Chair will then ask all parties present for that agenda item to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will give a brief outline of the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. The Licensing Officer will present the report, outlining any relevant representations and relevancies to the Redditch Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy and Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. The Licensing Officer may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee and, if given permission by the Sub-Committee, the other parties present.
  - (Similar rights of questioning will apply, with the Sub-Committee's permission, in relation to paragraphs 7, 9 and 11 below.)
- 6. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative will speak in support of the application.
- 7. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee.
- 8. Any witnesses called, with due notice, by the applicant will, with the permission of the Sub-Committee, then make representations to the Sub-Committee.
  - (Similar rights will apply in relation to witnesses called by other parties.)
- 9. The witnesses may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee.

- 10. Any person who has given notice that they wish to make representations to the Sub-Committee will be invited to do so, having stated the nature of his / her interest in the matter.
  - (a) In the case of any person who has made representations but fails to attend, the hearing will normally proceed, taking into consideration the written representations, but ensuring appropriate weight is given to the representations.
  - (b) No person wishing to make representations may raise any ground or objection at the hearing not previously referred to in the written submission, unless all parties give their consent to this.
- 11. Once a person making representations has concluded their case, he / she may be questioned by the members of the Sub-Committee Committee.
- 12. The Licensing Officer will be invited to make a closing statement.
- 13. Any persons who have made representations will be invited to sum up.
- 14. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative will be invited to sum up.
- 15. The Chair will announce an adjournment of the hearing in order for the Sub-Committee to make its decision. The decision will be made in private and the Chair will, in accordance with the legal framework given in Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972 as amended by the Local Government (Access to Information) (Variation) Order 2006, move to exclude all parties present, with the exception of the members of the Sub-Committee and the legal and administrative support Officers, from the Sub-Committee's deliberations. Normally the Sub-Committee, legal adviser and committee administrator will withdraw from the room.
- 16. The Sub-Committee may return to the meeting room to seek clarification on any point. The Sub-Committee, legal advisor and committee administrator will then withdraw again.
- 17. The Chair may depart from the above procedure if he / she considers it is in the interests of natural justice to do so, either of his / her own volition or upon application by any party. Before doing so he / she shall invite the views of the parties present and consider any representations that may be made.

## **Decision**

- 18. The hearing will reconvene, all parties being recalled.
- 19. The Chair will announce the decision, together with reasons for it in public at the conclusion of the hearing, together with any conditions placed upon the licence and the licensing objective they relate to.
- 20. The decision will be confirmed in writing to the Applicant / Licence Holder and his / her representative (if appropriate), and to the other parties to the hearing, and also to the Chief Officer of Police, as soon as is practicable after the hearing.

#### Notes

- 1. Any changes in Sub-Committee membership will be given at the beginning of the meeting.
- 2. Each party will be limited to a maximum time of ten minutes in which to make representations to the Sub-Committee. This period may be extended at the discretion of the Chair. If an extension is agreed, all parties are to be allowed the same time to make representations. Where appropriate, if several parties wish to make the same representation, a spokesperson may, by consent, be appointed, in which case the spokesperson is to be allowed the same period of time as other representatives. If a spokesperson is not appointed, the amount of time must be shared between the persons wishing to make the same representation.
- 3. Any person wishing to make representations and Applicants / Licence Holders can be represented by a legal representative (at their own expense) or by a Councillor.
- 4. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- 5. Parties to the hearing will not normally be entitled to cross-examine any other party unless given permission by the Sub-Committee to do so.
- 6. The Sub-Committee may require any person attending the hearing, who in its opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the hearing and may:
  - refuse to permit that person to return; or
  - permit that person to return only on such conditions as the Sub-Committee specify,

but such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any such information which they would have given orally had they not been required to leave.

- 7. Decisions will generally be taken regardless of whether the applicant is present.
- 8. In cases where a decision cannot be given at the end of the hearing, the Sub-Committee will make its decision within 5 working days beginning with the day or the last day on which the hearing was held, and will inform the applicant as soon as is practicable thereafter of its decision.
- 9. Applicants have a right to appeal, details of which can be obtained via the Licensing Officer.
- 10. It is not the general policy of the Council to enter into discussions or correspondence on matters relating to the hearing or any decision made at the hearing.
- 11. Any irregularity resulting from any failure to comply with any provision of the relevant Regulations before the Sub-Committee has made a determination shall not of itself render the proceedings void. In the case of such irregularity, the Sub-Committee shall, if it considers that any person may have been prejudiced as a result of such irregularity, take such steps as it thinks fit to cure the irregularity prior to determination.
- 12. Clerical errors in any document recording a determination of the Sub-Committee or errors arising in such document from accidental slip or omission may be corrected by the Sub-Committee.
- 13. Parties are not normally permitted to cross-examine or question other parties at Licensing Sub-Committee hearings except with the permission of the Sub-Committee. It is important that questions should not be hostile or seek to unfairly undermine the position of any party.



I wish to object to the above application on the grounds of the noise, disruption, parking and vehicular issues caused by the events and late opening hours being applied for.

Even to the most untrained observer, it should be obvious that what is being applied for in this application is totally inappropriate to the location of the premises involved. I recently read a poster attached to a post in Oakley Road Redditch which informs those of us in the area who can read English ( would it not be fairer to have some of the posters written in other languages commonly used in this area ) that an application has been made to extend the opening hours at 118 Oakley Road ( known locally as the Polish Club ).

I have some reservations in respect of these proposed changes. I list my concerns below.

From my property I may be subjected to late night noise, particularly in the summer when windows of both my property and at 118 Oakley Road may be open .

A rise in traffic, both road and pavement, passing my home in the early hours of the morning. In both cases alcohol may well affect their ability to negotiate the route in a quiet and safe manner.

Therefore, am I correct in thinking that the Polish Catholic Mission should also be applying for a licence? as they too, as an organisation provide entertainment, hire the hall out and run lunch clubs, dinner and dance, etc, etc.

If they do, already have a licence for this. Who is the person responsible for the community hall?

As a resident of Oakly Rd I have already started experiencing problems over recent weeks with nuisance noise from drunken customers, as a result of this new application.

I am some what surprised that this change has been allowed to happen and that trading has started without giving residence the right to appeal first. After all, this appears to be a new application by a new body for a separate business and not a modification or change to the existing licence.

I do hope you can explain to me how it has been possible, that they have already started trading.

My concerns are, now that this place is no longer run as a private members club. They will start to attract a different type of cliental and will result in disorderly behaviour on the street late at night. This has become evident over the last few weeks.

Also the late night arrival of Taxis picking up customers is also causing disturbance to the neighbourhood.

The emergency doors from the hall facing the road are now being used regularly and are left open late into the night, thus carrying the noise from the hall on to the street.

I believe that there was an enclosure on the previous licence for the emergency doors to only be used for it's purpose and occasional loading and unloading of entertainers equipment. All windows to be closed after 22.00 hrs and taxis collections/drops to be made at the rear car park only.

My fear is that, if they carry on trading with a total disregard for the public. Oakly Rd will become a less desirable place to live in and there will be a lot of unhappy current residence.

I do hope you can take the points of this letter into serious consideration and I shall look forward to hearing from you soon.

To whom it may concern,

We write with regard to the application for extended licensing hours made by The Polish/Continental club, located in Oakly Road.

We wish you to know that we object most strongly to these proposals.

Oakly Road is a wholly residential area-and whilst the current hours that the club opens causes only minimal disruption in the area, chiefly in parking, these proposed new hours would have a serious and unacceptable impact on all those who live here.

We feel the club has failed to recognise that the majority of residents are working people, and that very few people now work 'office hours, Monday to Friday.' A considerable proportion of us work shifts, and weekends. Certainly in the houses around the club, you will see many people leaving for work from 5 o'clock in the morning- weekends included.

Just when are we supposed to sleep when the club wishes to be running until 2am on Friday & Saturday? People leaving the club will make noise, vocal and vehicle- for probably another half hour or so- meaning we are expected to manage on around 3 hours sleep.

It occasionally causes problems already, especially in the summer- you want to have your windows open for fresh air, and if they have a function, you have to sleep in ear plugs, and that only quietens the noise a little, it does not cut it out completely.

Surely the town centre has sufficient pubs, clubs and bars that open for these hours, seven days a week? The fact that these are within a clear commercial area means minimal disruption to residential areas, and enables better policing of the inevitable drunken behaviour.

It will not only create a noise problem from the club itself via music, there will be vehicle noise from taxi's/cars arriving & leaving, car doors slamming, attendees at the club gathering outside, so vocal noise from laughing, shouting, talking, road traffic increases, difficulties in parking for residents, as so few club visitors use its car park, and noise from those leaving the club to walk into town or home. A walk through the town any weekend night will provide ample evidence of the type of behaviour that these hours will inflict on us. Anyone who has been consuming alcohol until this time of the morning is going to be unconcerned about whether they wake anyone up!

There is also the concern about vandalism and damage to vehicles and property- we cannot bury our heads in the sand and pretend that these things are not very likely. We all know that after consuming alcohol for this

length of time, things like scratching cars/breaking off mirrors& aerials, damaging hanging baskets, urinating in and on peoples property etc etc appear highly amusing to certain people! Not to mention vomiting in the street- we are the ones who will have to get up to, and put up with this.

Please do not misunderstand, we ourselves like a night out occasionally- we are not objecting because its something we do not do- it is simply that a residential area is not the place for these opening hours. Neither are we objecting out of any personal issue- you can see that we live right next door to the club, have done for 15 years, and have always had an excellent relationship with those who run it, and many of its clients. Only recently they were good enough to allow us to have some scaffolding placed within their grounds so that our roof could be replaced. We simply feel that opening for 7 nights a week, two of them until 2am, is unacceptable for the area.

Has anyone considered the Sheltered Housing for the elderly, which is situated behind the club? There is a footpath that runs from Oakly Road down to Plymouth Road, which will be bound to get a lot of use. So the elderly residents are also going to be subjected to the same types of nuisance as we will, along with the sound travelling from the clubs functions.

We believe the proposed hours to be completely unreasonable and unnecessary . As we have already stated, the town is well served with pubs, clubs and bars. It is not as though these opening hours are addressing a lack of entertainment opportunities.

We are sure there also would not have been objections if this had been an application of OCCASIONAL extensions, for parties etc. It is the fact that it is proposed for 7 nights a week together with the 2am weekend close that has angered residents.

If the council feels that it should approve this application, even after taking on board the objections of residents, we would hope that it would be for an initial trial period of a few months, in order that its impact on residents and the area could then be reassessed, based on hard evidence, rather than putting us in a position of having to put up with whatever problems it causes us for a year or more until the licence is due for renewal.

- 7.5 The Licensing Authority <u>will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at licensed premises on members of the public living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.</u>
- 7.6 The Licensing Law is not the primary mechanism for the general control of nuisance and anti social behaviour by individuals once they are away from licensed premises, and therefore, beyond the direct control of the individual club, or business holding the licence, certificate or authorisation concerned.

  Nonetheless, it is a key aspect of such control and Licensing Law will always be part of a holistic approach to the management of the evening and night time economy in the town centres.
  - The Licensing Authority will have a flexible approach to hours when alcohol can be sold or supplied. It will give more freedom to responsible licensees, but may impose stricter controls on particular licensed premises, such as those effecting residential properties.

We wish to object to the above application on the grounds of the noise, disruption, parking and vehicular issues by the events and late opening hours being applied for.

Even to the most untrained observer it should be obvious that what is being applied for in this application is totally inappropriate to the location of the premises involved. These premises are housed in an extended residential property, with limited access and parking, situated right in the middle of a high density residential area. A large number of old peoples flats in Bentley Close are on the site adjoining the premises.

The noise caused by a number of the events proposed in the application would cause disturbance to local residents, especially the old.

There is only a small car park at the rear of the premises, and Oakley Road, where the premises are situated, has a residents parking scheme and no spaces available, therefore patrons would be likely to park in surrounding streets such as Salop Road, Bentley Close and even Plymouth Road, so the potential disruption and noise caused late at night is obvious.

We, the undersigned urge you to reject this application.

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

Dear Councillor,

I am writing to you to formally object to the application for an extension to the licensing hours being extended at Continental (Polish) Club in Oakley Road.

We have been residents at 18 Salop Road for 25 years and have had numerous problems with late night revellers returning home from the Oakley Road direction in a rowdy state. If extended hours were granted this would add to the problem.

There is already an issue with noise coming from the club at the moment, especially during the summer months when the windows and doors are open.

This is a residential area and has a high density of people living in it.

The impact on the residents of Bentley Close would be especially harsh as they are all old age pensioners and would not appreciate extra rowdy noise late at night.

The gardens and car park of the Continental Club back directly onto those of Bentley Close, Salop Road and Oakley Road.

Local residents already incur the early morning noise form the bus station when they warm up the engines. The addition of extra late night noise as well would further increase the interference of noise pollution in what should be the quiet hours of the day.

Parking in the area is also very problematic as the residents parking in Oakley Road and restrictions on Mount Pleasant has pushed the parking problems for the town centre even more into Salop Road and Bentley Close. This would cause further problems in the late evenings should a licence be granted.

I have today (Thursday 19th) been to inspect the notice of application posted on the exterior wall of the club so as to be fully aware of the detail of the application.

This has been impossible to do as it is rain damaged and impossible to read. I do not know how long this has been the case, but it seems therefore the statutory time the notice should be visibly displayed for has been contravened.

As a former Redditch Town Councillor for the Central Ward I am fully aware of the historic problems of this small area and I am sure that the granting of an extension the the licensing hours of this club would be an inconsiderate decision for the local residents.

I hope you will take these comments into account and refuse this application.
