#### COMMITTEE PROTOCOL – LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE

Each application that comes before this Sub-Committee will be treated on its own merits. This licensing authority will make its decision based on the merits of the application and the promotion of the four licensing objectives, namely:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm,

and will also have regard to the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Redditch Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy.

Members of the Sub-Committee will meet prior to the hearing to note matters to be presented, assisted by the legal and administrative support Officers only. The actual application will not be discussed.

#### LICENSING HEARING PROCEDURE

#### The Hearing

- 1. The Chair will open the meeting, outlining the nature of the decision to be taken, and will identify the members of the Sub-Committee and Council Officers present.
- 2. The Chair will then ask all parties present for that agenda item to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will give a brief outline of the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. The Licensing Officer will present the report, outlining any relevant representations and relevancies to the Redditch Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy and Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. The Licensing Officer may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee and, if given permission by the Sub-Committee, the other parties present.

(Similar rights of questioning will apply, with the Sub-Committee's permission, in relation to paragraphs 7, 9 and 11 below.)

- 6. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative will speak in support of the application.
- 7. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee.
- 8. Any witnesses called, with due notice, by the applicant will, with the permission of the Sub-Committee, then make representations to the Sub-Committee.

(Similar rights will apply in relation to witnesses called by other parties.)

9. The witnesses may be questioned by members of the Sub-Committee.

- 10. Any person who has given notice that they wish to make representations to the Sub-Committee will be invited to do so, having stated the nature of his / her interest in the matter.
  - (a) In the case of any person who has made representations but fails to attend, the hearing will normally proceed, taking into consideration the written representations, but ensuring appropriate weight is given to the representations.
  - (b) No person wishing to make representations may raise any ground or objection at the hearing not previously referred to in the written submission, unless all parties give their consent to this.
- 11. Once a person making representations has concluded their case, he / she may be questioned by the members of the Sub-Committee Committee.
- 12. The Licensing Officer will be invited to make a closing statement.
- 13. Any persons who have made representations will be invited to sum up.
- 14. The Applicant / Licence Holder and / or his / her representative will be invited to sum up.
- 15. The Chair will ask the Legal Advisor if there is any legal advice to be given
- 16. At the conclusion of the hearing members of the Sub-Committee, the Legal Advisor and the Democratic Services Officer will withdraw from the meeting room so that the Sub-Committee can reach its decision in private.
- 17. The Sub-Committee may return to the meeting room to seek clarification on any point. The Sub-Committee, Legal Advisor and Democratic Services Officer will then withdraw again.
- 18. The Chair may depart from the above procedure if he / she considers it is in the interests of natural justice to do so, either of his / her own volition or upon application by any party. Before doing so he / she shall invite the views of the parties present and consider any representations that may be made.

#### **Decision**

19. The Sub-Committee's decision will not be announced on the day of the hearing but rather it will be sent to the Applicant and all those parties who made representations within 5 working days.

#### <u>Notes</u>

- 1. Any changes in Sub-Committee membership will be given at the beginning of the meeting.
- 2. Each party will be limited to a maximum time of ten minutes in which to make representations to the Sub-Committee. This period may be extended at the discretion of the Chair. If an extension is agreed, all parties are to be allowed the same time to make representations. Where appropriate, if several parties wish to make the same representation, a spokesperson may, by consent, be appointed, in which case the spokesperson is to be allowed the same period of time as other

representatives. If a spokesperson is not appointed, the amount of time must be shared between the persons wishing to make the same representation.

- 3. Any person wishing to make representations and Applicants / Licence Holders can be represented by a legal representative (at their own expense) or by a Councillor.
- 4. Late representations and evidence will only be considered with the agreement of all parties present.
- 5. Parties to the hearing will not normally be entitled to cross-examine any other party unless given permission by the Sub-Committee to do so.
- 6. The Sub-Committee may require any person attending the hearing, who in its opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the hearing and may:
  - refuse to permit that person to return; or
  - permit that person to return only on such conditions as the Sub-Committee specify,

but such person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing any such information which they would have given orally had they not been required to leave.

- 7. Decisions will generally be taken regardless of whether the applicant is present.
- 8. In cases where a decision cannot be given at the end of the hearing, the Sub-Committee will make its decision within 5 working days beginning with the day or the last day on which the hearing was held, and will inform the applicant as soon as is practicable thereafter of its decision.
- 9. Applicants have a right to appeal, details of which can be obtained via the Licensing Officer.
- 10. It is not the general policy of the Council to enter into discussions or correspondence on matters relating to the hearing or any decision made at the hearing.
- 11. Any irregularity resulting from any failure to comply with any provision of the relevant Regulations before the Sub-Committee has made a determination shall not of itself render the proceedings void. In the case of such irregularity, the Sub-Committee shall, if it considers that any person may have been prejudiced as a result of such irregularity, take such steps as it thinks fit to cure the irregularity prior to determination.
- 12. Clerical errors in any document recording a determination of the Sub-Committee or errors arising in such document from accidental slip or omission may be corrected by the Sub-Committee.
- 13. Parties are not normally permitted to cross-examine or question other parties at Licensing Sub-Committee hearings except with the permission of the Sub-Committee. It is important that questions should not be hostile or seek to unfairly undermine the position of any party.

#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for review of the premises licence in respect of the premises below:

Easemore Club 25 Easemore Road Redditch Worcestershire B98 8ER

#### 2. BACKGROUND

2.1 An application has been received from Police Constable Andrew Freeman acting on behalf of the Chief Officer of West Mercia Police and appyling for review of the premises licence in respect of:

Easemore Club 25 Easemore Road Redditch Worcestershire B98 8ER

- 2.2 The application relates to the following licensing objectives:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of public nuisance
- 2.3 The grounds for the review application are set out in the application form. A copy of the application form and supporting documents can be seen at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.4 It can be confirmed that the application has been advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and associated regulations and that the application has also been served on all responsible authorities.
- 2.5 The current premises licence is held by Mr Graham Alcott. Mr Alcott is also named on the premises licence as the designated premises supervisor. A copy of the current premises licence can be seen at **Appendix 2**.

#### 3. REPRESENTATIONS

#### **Responsible Authorities**

3.1 No representations have been received from any of the other responsible authorities in respect of the application.

#### Other Persons

- 3.2 A total of five representations have been received from other persons regarding the review application.
- 3.3 The representations support the police application and raise various concerns about the way the premises has been operated by the licence holder Mr Alcott.
- 3.4 Copies of the representations received from other persons can be seen at **Appendix 3**.

#### 4. LOCAL POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1 The Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy under the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives which are:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance;
  - the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the applications, the representations that have been made and the evidence it hears during the hearing.

- 5.4 The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence by altering, omitting or adding a new condition.
  - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
  - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor
  - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
  - (e) to revoke the licence
- 5.5 All parties to the hearing will be notified of the Sub-Committee's decision in writing within five working days of the conclusion of the hearing.
- 5.6 Any party aggrieved by a decision taken by the Sub-Committee may appeal against the decision to a Magistrates' Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.
- 5.7 The hearing should be conducted in accordance with the agreed procedure.

#### 6. FOR DECISION

6.1 The Sub-Committee must consider and determine the application.

From January 2018 there have been increased calls either about or requesting to attend the Easemore Social club. These calls are reporting issues that include general anti-social behaviour that ranges from loud noise, drunken behaviour, swearing, foul abusive language, domestic incidents, assaults and drug use.

In addition there have been reports of loud arguments at various time of the day through to the early hours of the morning, this is causing a disturbance to local residents who are not able to enjoy the rear gardens, having to leave windows and doors shut and generally feeling intimidated.

Added to these issues reports that on an almost daily basis the smell of cannabis can be detected from the club this includes the rear car park of the club.

The above issues have had a detrimental effect on the lives of the local residents due to the nuisance of the behaviour of the customers and the failure the manager to deal with these issues.

The number of calls to the club appear to be out of proportion to other licensed establishments within Redditch town centre.

Graham Allcott has been met on 2 occasions by Officers from West Mercia Police and Worcester Regulatory Services regarding the above reported problems but there has been no improvement in the issues being experienced by local resident and calls to the police.

A total of 44 incidents have been called into the Police either by members of the public or staff at the club,

Reference: Complaints of disorder Easemore Social Club

With regards to the above as the Abbey Safer Neighbourhood Officer I have received numerous complaints from residents of Easemore Road in regard to the ongoing issues at the Easemore Road Social Club.

Over the past six months we have received 34 complaints of anti-social behaviour that range from general swearing in and around the premises, smell of cannabis that originates from the club, through to fights and general disorder.

You will appreciate this is having a severe impact on the residents of Easemore Road to their quality of life and hence the purpose of my visit with Worcester Regulatory Services today.

As the owner and designated premises supervisor of Easemore Social Club it is not only your responsibility to ensure that all your licence (number 15/0188/PREMLI) conditions are adhered to but there is an underlying requirement/duty to ensure that no public nuisance is caused from the premises.

Another concern with regards to the reported disorder within the club is the safety of any staff employed at the Easemore Social Club as they are the ones who will be dealing with these matters initially.

I have noted that since your meeting with Sergeant Gilkes and PCSO Yarwood on the 6th June 2018 that there have been a further 10 reports of anti-social behaviour originating from the club after the assurances provided by you at this meeting, it would appear that these have not been addressed and anti-social behaviour is still taking place.

We would seek to work with you in a mood of voluntary co-operation to address the levels of anti-social behaviour and thereby reduce any public nuisance, I would ask that if you require

2) Restrict times allowed outside of front of club to drink:

These times reflect an attempt to deal with reported ASB at this location.

- 3) To use SIA licensed door staff to patrol front, side, rear and car park of premises, to deal with any associated ASB, drug use and drinking on car park. Again this reflects the concern for ASB and criminal activity being reported.
- 4) To extend CCTV coverage of premises to cover front, side, rear and carpark. Again in an attempt to deal with ASB.

5) For bar staff/management to maintain a clear distinction between being friendly and social with customers and maintaining their roles within a licensed premises.

## **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

### The making and authorisation of alcohol sales

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Irresponsible alcohol promotions

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

#### Provision of free potable water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

#### Age verification policy for the sale or supply of alcohol

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

#### Availability of small measures of alcohol

The responsible person must ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
  - (i) beer or cider: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### Permitted price of alcohol

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
  - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979);
  - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

#### P = D + (DxV)

where---

P is the permitted price,

D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

In relation to Public Nuisance

All music from the premises must be contained inside the building causing no nuisance to local residents. There is to be no playing of music of any description outside of the building and in the patio area. This includes the use of radio or stereo systems of any description even provided by customers.
 At all times music is being performed at the premises, regular Staff visits will be made outside the perimeter of the building to ensure that the above condition is complied with times and dates of checks will be recorded for examination by Police and any Authorised Officer.

3. The use of the outside patio area must cease at 2200hrs daily and cleared by Staff who will ensure no drinks are permitted outside of the building after this time. Signage will be installed advising customers of this condition.

4. Appropriate signage will be placed both inside the premises and on the patio area outside directing patrons to behave in a quiet and orderly manner to the consideration of local residents.

5. The Premises Licence Holder will give 14 days prior notice in writing warning local residents of any events/functions that finish at anytime later than midnight.

6. No bottles will be emptied into any outside skip between the hours of 2100hrs and 0900hrs daily.

In relation to Crime and Disorder

1. CCTV cameras are to be installed at the premises. The installation of a fully operational digital CCTV system must be to the satisfaction of the Police and the Local Authority.

2. Cameras shall be of high resolution and provide imaging of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY.

3. Equipment must be maintained in good working order, and set to reproduce the correct date and time on all imaging.

4. The CCTV must be operational and recording throughout all times that the premises are open to the public.

5. Recordings must be retained for a period of 28 days and will be made available to the Police or any Authorised Officer on request.

6. The Premises Licence holder must ensure at all times that the Designated Premises Supervisor or an appointed member of Staff is capable and competent to download imagery from the CCTV system in a recordable format within 24 hours of such a request from the Police or any other authorised Officer.

In relation to the Protection of Children from Harm

1. A challenge 21 Policy must be adopted with all Staff trained by the Designated Premises Supervisor and Staff Training Records kept in relation to all aspects of licensing legislation and conditions imposed on the licence. These records must be made available at the premises for examination by the Police or any other Authorised Person.

With reference to the licence review of the above premises I would like my objection to be considered in your deliberations regarding the licence.

I would like the licence REVOKED for the following reason which I have personally witnessed on occasions.

Initially when the club re-opened some 5 years or so ago it seemed pleasant, quiet and a controlled establishment but after a while and to date since the front was opened up

I have seen, heard and been made aware of the following on a regular basis throughout the opening hours and until very late.

1. Customers being very loud and the more they drink the louder it gets.

2. I have heard 2 male customer shout racial abuse at a passing muslim woman and no intervention by staff or other customers

3. You regularly hear the customers using profanities most of the time and again increasing in abuse and noise levels as the evening goes on and sometimes in the day when the weather is warm.

4. I have used the club on a number of occasions and witnessed customers falling out with each other arguing and on one occasion I saw them fighting and also heard the same on other occasions and NO intervention to stop it immediately before escalation

5. Some of the customers seem uncontrolled by their behaviour. I have heard glasses smashed and bottles/litter/cigarette ends in and around the club.

6. Some of the customers feel it necessary to intimidate or harass passers by.

7.

8. The property has coolers/equipment etc on the roof which is noisy and disturbs night-time peace.

9. People (not always associated with the club) use and abuse the carpark at the rear where unruly behaviour exists and believed criminal activities both in cars and on foot because it is not secure and is hidden from public view. There is no obvious intervention by the licence holder, responsible person or the police to prevent or detect any offences.

10. Young people seem to frequent the establishment when you would think they should be at home and in bed.

Please confirm receipt of my observations with regards to the licence review.

I have however fully informed PC 214 Andy Freeman (D Div) at Redditch Station of the issues and activity at the club and my consequent concerns and have sent him detailed notes and diaries of events.

I would ask that you request sight of my full submissions to PC Freeman when considering the licence review which my neighbours and I would very much like to see revoked.

These include serious anti-social behaviour and disorder, drug use, incidents of abusive behaviour and assault, alcohol served outside of licensing hours, breach of security to neighbouring properties and the very poor attitude of the licensee.

A number of my neighbours and I are strongly opposed to this club, the activities and behaviour of which are wholly inappropriate in a residential area.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing this letter in support of the application to review the license of the Easemore Social Club. We have lived since March 2016 and have consistently found the licensee Graham Alcott to be unwilling and incapable of promoting public safety and preventing crime, disorder, and public nuisance.

I have found living both stressful and intimidating. In the early days, we tried to communicate with Graham whenever we had an issue in the hope he would try to resolve it however it soon became apparent he didn't care about our wellbeing. For instance, he installed an industrial fan without asking us first, which was like an airplane engine and disrupted our sleep while I was heavily pregnant. When we asked politely if it could be removed because it was adversely affecting my wellbeing, Graham at first said he would and then started to ignore our requests and his staff even began to put the phone down on us when we called the club to ask them to turn the fan off late at night. This was very stressful and harmful to our relationship.

Since having our baby, my partner has been threatened by an aggressive patron who threatened him while he was holding our baby. Whilst unloading the car, on our driveway and holding our newborn, my partner overheard some aggressive swearing after returning from a lunchtime trip to the shops (this was around 1pm) and stopped to turn around to look. The man asked my partner what the f\*\*\* he was looking at and asked him whether he wanted a fight from the terrace. The fact that this aggressive and violent man knew where we lived made me scared to report this incident to the police.

More recently, Graham has invaded our privacy by sending one of his regulars to cut down all the foliage directly This foliage offers us some shelter and privacy and the (suspected) criminal activity that goes on there (we've frequently listened to drunken fights, drunken swearing and smelt marijuana being smoked). One morning I looked out my window and saw a man carelessly hacking these bushes down, without any prior warning (and doing a terrible job). I was shocked and when I asked the man what he was doing he aggressively shouted back "we know you have a problem with the social club". This made me feel intimidated, targeted and powerless.

In addition to this, I have been 'cat called' whilst walking past the club by an inebriated male during an afternoon drinking session. There are also regular fights and aggressive slanging matches (between groups of men, women and fighting couples) outside and along Easemore Road which frequently wake me up at night.

This has all made me feel very unsafe in my own home, especially since having a baby. My partner is regularly away on business leaving me alone with my baby in the house. I feel reluctant to call the police because I feel like the regulars know where we live and already assume we have "a problem with the social club". Some of them are very aggressive and I

feel very vulnerable. I also feel that Graham is unable to keep adequate control over his customers which makes the situation even worse.

We have tried to co-exist next to Graham and his staff, but there have been many occasions where he has been an ignorant or reckless licensee and neighbor. Most of the time when I walk past the club he is sat with his customers drinking large amounts of alcohol. He does not exercise any control over his patrons. They are loud and unruly, constant throw litter and urinate on the street and he seems to be egging them on whenever I pass by the club. I also understand he does not have a manager in the club to take control when he is not there. I think this is dangerous, given the type of person that uses the club. This lack of a manager was even more evident during the World Cup when there were multiple incidents in the car park out the back (the police were called at least once and Graham was seen to be very drunk whilst in charge – to the point where he could barely stand up straight).

I do not trust that he will take the necessary actions to keep me, my baby or my partner safe from his drunken patrons. I am too scared to report every incident to the police. I would highly recommend his license be revoked as he is an inadequate licensee and his failings are having an adverse effect on the area, and on the lives of me and my neighbors.

I agree with the police that the current license holder is failing to uphold the conditions of his licence on the grounds of crime and disorder, public nuisance and public safety and have personally witnessed incidents to support my claim.

I have directly challenged the licence holder earlier this year by telephone and requested from him that he ensues that his clients behave in a respectful manner. This is a residential Road with schools, College, church's and a registry office, it is a main route to the Town Centre. The Easemore Road club is not a good advertisement for Redditch. I have not seen evidence that he has managed to uphold my request.

I have witnessed a man ( believe around May 18) from the club, urinate against the club wall at around 3.20 pm on a school day, when young people are walking home. I have witnessed arguments outside of the club and on the terrace where customers sit on a regular basis.

Customers previously would make comments and remarks to passers by, and by the nature of how the terrace at the front of the club is structured this is intimidating for those walking past. I have had remarks made to my son by customers from the club.

We as a family have reported domestic abuse , and public nuisance incidents to the police.

During the summer when sitting in our back garden regularly are disturbed by customers out the back of the club, swearing, shouting and what would say kicking off outside.

I believe that there has been drug dealing at the back of the club, just by the nature of the behaviour of people.

Where Next association is at the back of the club, this agency has been situated there since the 80s, they support vulnerable people with learning disabilities. My husband has intervened in an incident from the club this year as he feared that it may on clients leaving where next.

My daughter who also lives in the road has had her back garden damaged following a disturbance from the club where someone was being chased and ran through gardens and hedges in an attempt to get away.

The summer brings with it regular disturbance from the club with what appears to be drinking from 9am through to the evening. There is excess litter in the road and people being sick, I have requested that the landlord extend his cleaning way beyond his front of club and drive.

Clients of the club regularly have their children at the club who are also privy to the behaviour of the clients and are at times present during disturbances. This is believe will have a negative impact on the health and well-being.

I regularly witness police and ambulance presence at the club and have commented to the landlord that I believe that he and his clients are a drain on the public resource and purse. I believe that these services should be there to serve those most in need.

I believe that no licence should be granted for the club. There are many licences establishments in the Town Centre.

I have also advised the police that late at night the car park must be used for the selling of drugs several time late at night i can here two cars driving into the car park then minutes later they drive out. I have also found his beer barrels been rolled down the road and left in the middle of the road. I really don't feel the licencee is a fit person to run this club as the discription that has been given to me by some of his customers is he drinks with them and is a heavy drinker.
