From January 2018 there have been increased calls either about or requesting to attend the Easemore Social club. These calls are reporting issues that include general anti-social behaviour that ranges from loud noise, drunken behaviour, swearing, foul abusive language, domestic incidents, assaults and drug use.

In addition there have been reports of loud arguments at various time of the day through to the early hours of the morning, this is causing a disturbance to local residents who are not able to enjoy the rear gardens, having to leave windows and doors shut and generally feeling intimidated.

Added to these issues reports that on an almost daily basis the smell of cannabis can be detected from the club this includes the rear car park of the club.

The above issues have had a detrimental effect on the lives of the local residents due to the nuisance of the behaviour of the customers and the failure the manager to deal with these issues.

The number of calls to the club appear to be out of proportion to other licensed establishments within Redditch town centre.

Graham Allcott has been met on 2 occasions by Officers from West Mercia Police and Worcester Regulatory Services regarding the above reported problems but there has been no improvement in the issues being experienced by local resident and calls to the police.

A total of 44 incidents have been called into the Police either by members of the public or staff at the club.

I am police Constable 214 of the West Mercia Police stationed at Redditch and I am the Safer Neighbourhood Officer working with the Abbey Safer neighbourhood Team based in Redditch, this covers the town centre, Abbeydale, Enfield and Riverside areas of Redditch.

This statement is in relation to the Easemore Club that is located at 25 Easemore Road Redditch Worcestershire B98 8ER and the concerns regarding what appears to be a disproportionate number of complaints of noise, disorderly behaviour and of anti-social behaviour that is causing local residents distress, fear and that is affecting their quality of life.

I have looked at the premises licence number (15/01880/PRELI) and see that the opening hours of the premises are as follows:

Sunday: From 10:00 to 22:00

Monday to Thursday: From 09:00 to 23:30

Friday to Saturday: From 09:00 to 00:00

These issues that began to be reported to West Mercia police, starting from January 2018 I have examined West Mercia command and control system (OIS) to provide the following information.

OIS 0646S 300118 (19:24 hours) report of male being abusive and that he has thrown a chair through a double glazed window. Male has verbally abused bar staff member using foul abusive language. Police have attended male arrested for an unrelated matter during arrest male became violent towards officers

### February 2018

OIS 0695s 020218 report of a fight alleyway/behind Easemore club, Police have attended found a group at side of club who had been rowdy but none of this group willing to speak with officers.

### March 2018

OIS 0677S 020318 report of "everyone fighting", staff stating that they need police now large group of males fighting, police call handler could hear disturbance in background. Further update that persons fighting had left via rear of club, on police arrival no complaints and nobody willing to talk to police officers.

OIS 0569S 040318 (19:27 hours) I have been hit over the head by a male mid 20's-I feel a bit faint and sick. Caller stated did not know why he had been hit by this person but that he was still in the club sat at the bar smoking a fag. Police attended suspect had left but crime recorded for assault.

OIS 0519S 290318 (17:16 hours) about 20 minutes ago I passed a toddler running in road. This log relates to a young child found without parents running around and when asked where his mother was ran back to the Easemore Club. Caller states she spoke with male outside club who stated that the child's mother would kill him. Mother has exited from club said thank you to caller for finding child took child into club and shut door.

0097S 310318 (03:20 hours) staff call police stating think someone trying to break in, this turned out to be a drunken resident of flat above the club trying to gain entry after forgetting keys.

**April 2018**

OIS 0280S 020418 (13:04 hours) call from Graham Allcott report that a member of staff was working on her own there is a woman refusing to leave shouting and screaming and refusing to leave. Staff member is alone and is 19 years old, there is a female being abusive and people are leaving the club because of her, staff member very scared. Police attend and remove female from premises.

OIS 0585S 040518 (17:11 hours) report of 2 persons causing trouble, threatening a male over being served first, police attend report verbal argument. Males left prior to police arrival.

OIS 0686S 040518 (18:46 hours) request from staff males causing a disturbance within club have head butted someone, both suspect and male leave scene before police arrival.

Victim called and was awaiting police, however staff member at 00:50 hours has spoken with police saying she wanted to lock pub but female would not leave.

OIS 0341S 100518 (13:46 hours) call from member of public complaining regarding drug use, high level of noise and anti-social behaviour all times of the day. Also reporting the use of cannabis, caller stated that they had witnessed the other day a chair thrown from front of club into road.

OIS 0037S 190518 (00:49 hours) customer reporting that he is being threatened to be assaulted

OIS 0031S 290518 (00:54 hours) report from staff that 2 persons are fighting, staff having difficulty with clients who would not leave, one male assaulted. OIS 0703s 010618 (19:11 hours) complaint from member of public regarding drinking at front of premises, noise getting louder, use of marijuana, arguments, cheering. Caller states that they were asked by a child for a cigarette, lots of children amongst the group's of people.

OIS 0819S 060618 (21.11 HOURS) member of the public complaining about the smell of weed coming from the social club. Caller stated that he had worked with drug addicts in the past and recognised the smell.

OIS 0006s 060618 (00:11) Ambulance reporting female patient cutting her wrists in toilet at Easemore social club, information that this patient has been assaulted by member of bar staff, crime for assault submitted. Linked to log below.

OIS 0008S 060618 (00:16 hours) anon call complaining about noise from club believed there had been a fight at club. Police attend bar staff report female had to be physically removed, this customer had been verbal abusive. Linked to log above.

OIS 0778S 070618 21:17 hours) report from intoxicated male stating that he had been assaulted in club, staff spoken with who stated male had ben abusive towards other persons. Victim subsequently spoken with stated no assault that it was only a verbal argument as he was asked to leave club.

OIS 0588S 100618 (17:09) member of public complaining that customers where at the front, arguing, drinking and being loud causing ASB.

OIS 0021S 140618 (01:12 hours) member of the public reporting via 999 system that a male was attacking a female behind club. Caller states female was chased by male alongside of club into Easemore Road, female was shouting she wanted her stuff back. Police attend speak with female party stated she was on her own, no visible injuries, intoxicated confirmed there had been loads of people earlier did not disclose any offences.

Wed 13/06/2018 report via E mail from member of the public reporting prolonged ASB throughout ~~afternoon~~ into the evening, shouting jeering, minor arguments.

Report states there were 3 "nasty domestic" incidents that included shouting, screaming and swearing that included using the FUCK & CUNT word .In one of the domestic's a young baby was present.

01:10 hour's complainant woken up by a loud/ugly argument taking place in rear car park of club.

Thurs 14<sup>th</sup> & Fri 15<sup>th</sup> June as per above being reported, reporting seeing Graham Alcott sat outside with customers watching what was taking place.

OIS 0634S 240618 (18:53 hours) report from member of the public complaining of ASB at front of club, barbecue taking place a lot of shouting swearing. Use of cannabis being reported with young children present when all the above taking place.

OIS 0636S 240618 (19:01 hours) report from member of the public mass brawl at club, sounds like fighting, officers attend reporting about 50 persons present with shouting and arguing going on, persons begin to disperse with some other customers being escorted off the premises.

OIS 0713S 240618 (20:06 hours) another report of cannabis being used at club, same caller confirms they had called for a fight earlier on.

### **July 2018**

OIS 0049s 080718 (00:48 hours) call reporting an argument about who hit who, officers have attended but found club closed.

OIS 0021S 080718 (19:47 hours) report from staff reporting "everybody fighting", goes on to state stopped physically but still arguing, caller states one female hit. Officers attend find persons have gone with others still huddled in groups, no complaints.

OIS 0202S 250718 (10:20 hours) another report of a person being assaulted in club, caller states my friend was assaulted on Sunday by her brothers girlfriend ringing on her behalf as she is deaf., crime submitted for assault.

### August 2018

OIS 0544S 150818 (16:33 hours) report of domestic outside social club on car park, lots of shouting. Police attend report no domestic but male upset over recent bereavement.

OIS 0797S 220818 (22:01 hours) report of load of males outside front of club, shouting, jeering, using foul language and noise getting worse.

OIS 0862S 220818 (23:47 hours) report from staff that a male had been assaulted staff were attempting to kick everyone out saw one male had blood on his face discovered that he had been assaulted. Police attended located and arrested suspect, subsequently discovered that male arrested was being employed at club as an unlicensed door man.

In addition I have been handed sets of diary sheets that have been completed by a local resident, these have been recorded in this manner to save time reporting direct to Police.

The one set of diary sheets records the incidents from 26<sup>th</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018, as will be seen these report ASB that is taking place from morning through too late at night and on a constant basis.

This ASB includes loud, rowdy behaviour, swearing, arguments that is taking place in front of Graham Alcott who is suspected to be drunk and not intervening.

The second set of diary sheets covers the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> August 2018 and again behaviour that is being reported include loud aggressive behaviour, swearing noise disturbance from both music and shouting. This ASB is taking place both at the front and rear of the club.

Within these diary sheets there are reports of Graham Alcott being drunk and drinking with the customers at front of the club and not dealing with the issues.

I can state myself that I have witnessed when driving past the Easemore Club that I have seen Graham Alcott sat outside the front drinking from a pint glass that appeared to contain beer or similar surrounded by customers.

Also I have attended the club in the afternoons to speak with Graham and found him to be drinking and smelling strongly of intoxicating liquor.

I have examined Innkeeper West Mercia's system that record matters connected with licensed premises, designated persons and other associated information. From this I note that a meeting was held with Graham Alcott and Sgt Gilkes regarding the issues at the club.

This meeting took place on the 6<sup>th</sup> June 2018 with PCSO Yarwood present, in this meeting Graham Alcott expressed his concerns regarding two specific persons but also that he was well aware of the increased calls to the police and wanting to reduce these. Stated that he had employed a SIA security person to deal with issues on a Friday and Saturday (this would appear to be a contradiction as per OIS log 0862S 220818) .

Subsequently due to ongoing complaints a joint meeting took place with David Etheridge and myself on the 25/06/2018 with Graham Alcott at the Easemore Social club. During this visit it was made absolutely clear to Graham Alcott that as the licence holder for the Easemore Social Club that he had responsibility that the premises were run in an orderly manner and that no public nuisance was caused that could be attributed to the club.

Graham Alcott accepted that he had left things slip and that he needed to get on top of these, I handed a letter to him regarding our visit detailing the nature of the complaints, his responsibilities and our wish to work together to reduce these.

I have attached a copy of this letter with this statement as well as copies of the diary sheets from the member of the public.

Regarding the ongoing issues at the Easemore Social club I have spoken with various members of the public who explained to me their experiences of living near to the Easemore Social club and how the ASB is affecting them.

These complaints are varied but all relate to the club, these include the drinking that is taking place at the front of the club from morning right through the evening to late at night, this leads to rowdy behaviour, shouting that includes foul and abusive language on an almost daily basis. This ASB is causing distress to local residents, adds a feeling of intimidation, noise nuisance and general rowdy behaviour.

One resident has made the observation when walking round Redditch town centre other licensed establishments who have outside areas for drinking do not have this level of noise and associated problems, at these locations there can be large numbers of persons present without the any shouting, jeering swearing taking place just low level conversation.

Regular arguments have been reported including domestic incidents, these have taken place inside and outside of the club both at the front and rear of the club, and a number of these have resulted in assaults. This again is causing a disturbance for residents with associated noise but by the very nature of these domestic incidents there is the potential for violence that adds to the residents fear and concerns.

There is regular reports of drugs being used both at the front and in particular on the rear car park of the club, this activity is taking place at various times of the day but it has been reported to me that it can be so bad local residents are unable to have their doors and windows open due to the smell of the drugs being used but also again the resulting ASB.

The use of the rear of the club and car park would appear to extend to consuming of alcohol as residents report that when the customers leave the front they just go to the back and continue drinking outside resulting to further ASB.

From the above logs it can be seen that there have been a number of assaults taken place including the latest one involving an unlicensed door man, this cannot be acceptable as this puts both customers and staff at risk.

My understanding is that where a person is guarding a licensed premises as a door supervisor then this person should hold a valid and current qualification in door supervision that is recognised by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).

Residents are informing me that their lives have suffered detrimentally due to the associated ASB activity from the Easemore Club, feelings from wanting to move from homes they have occupied for 30 years to feeling unsafe and the area generally suffering from the behaviour of customers of the club.

Some of the residents have attempted to deal with the issues by speaking with Graham Allcott and other persons outside the club at the time incidents taking place but have been met with the attitude you live next to a club what do you expect.

One resident reported while walking past the club, at the time had their young son with them, some of the customers who were outside the club were swearing, this person challenged them regarding their use of foul language that was clearly audible to other members of the public and son, this person was threatened by one of the customers to have his head knocked off.

These complaints have started on this scale from January 2018 right through to now and there have been no break in the complaints or any reduction in ASB or associated criminal matters.

For comparison purposes I have examined West Mercia's OIS system for other licensed premises for the period between 01/01/2018 to 24/08/2018 and can report the following:

Royal Enfield 15 incidents of assault, request for Police help, general ASB.

The Rising Sun 4 incidents assault, request for Police help, general ASB.

The Sportsman's Arms 3 incidents assault, request for Police help, general ASB.

The above figures compare with 44 incidents called in respect of the Easemore Social club let alone the incident's being reported via the diary sheets, as can be seen there is a very clear and extreme disproportion of calls to and about the Easemore Social club.

On THURSDAY 23rd AUGUST 2018 I was on uniformed mobile patrol when at around 09.15 hours I attended the THE EASEMORE CLUB, EASEMORE ROAD, REDDITCH to make enquiries regarding reports of an assault which happened around 23.00 hours on the WEDNESDAY 22nd AUGUST 2018.

As I arrived at the club I could see people drinking outside the location and on entering the club I could see around 8 people drinking inside. The time was around 09.15 hours and since this time I have been made aware that the licensing hours to serve alcohol is 09.30 hours on Thursday.

Whilst inside the location I spoke with a member of staff who was starting making enquiries regarding CCTV at the location. I have spoken with other customers inside the location who appeared intoxicated and stated that they had already had several pints making it clear to me that had been drinking there for some time.

I have left the location and spoken with the manager of the THE EASEMORE CLUB who gave his name as GRAHAM. I spoke with GRAHAM outside REDDITCH Police Station and he stated that he was annoyed that an incident happened at the club. He informed me that he had sacked the manager ANNE who was in charge at the time of the incident as she had been serving intoxicated customers and that he had viewed CCTV and she had been giving them the alcohol for free.

GRAHAM was also stated that LAMIN STEPHENS who was working for him as a doorman at the EASEMORE CLUB would also have to be sacked as he had been arrested for assault.

During the afternoon of THURSDAY 23<sup>rd</sup> AUGUST 2018 I attended Kidderminster Police Station and interviewed LAMIN STEPHENS regarding the assault at the EASEMORE CLUB. Following the interview LAMIN confirmed that he was currently employed as a doorman at the EASEMORE CLUB. I believe that LAMIN is not registered to conduct the role as doorman/supervisor.

I had no further dealings with this matter.

Reference: Complaints of disorder Easemore Social Club

With regards to the above as the Abbey Safer Neighbourhood Officer I have received numerous complaints from residents of Easemore Road in regard to the ongoing issues at the Easemore Road Social Club.

Over the past six months we have received 34 complaints of anti-social behaviour that range from general swearing in and around the premises, smell of cannabis that originates from the club, through to fights and general disorder.

You will appreciate this is having a severe impact on the residents of Easemore Road to their quality of life and hence the purpose of my visit with Worcester Regulatory Services today.

As the owner and designated premises supervisor of Easemore Social Club it is not only your responsibility to ensure that all your licence (number 15/0188/PREMLI) conditions are adhered to but there is an underlying requirement/duty to ensure that no public nuisance is caused from the premises.

Another concern with regards to the reported disorder within the club is the safety of any staff employed at the Easemore Social Club as they are the ones who will be dealing with these matters initially.

I have noted that since your meeting with Sergeant Gilkes and PCSO Yarwood on the 6th June 2018 that there have been a further 10 reports of anti-social behaviour originating from the club after the assurances provided by you at this meeting, it would appear that these have not been addressed and anti-social behaviour is still taking place.

We would seek to work with you in a mood of voluntary co-operation to address the levels of anti-social behaviour and thereby reduce any public nuisance, I would ask that if you require

Police assistance to deal with these matters that you do so but I must make it absolutely clear that if there is no significant improvement in the coming weeks and months that I reserve the right to escalate the matter to a Senior Police Officer to review the Easemore Social Club licence.

This letter is to ask that we work together, yourself, West Mercia Police and Worcester Regulatory Services to resolve the issues so that the quality of life for Easemore Residents is significantly improved and that the Easemore Social Club is shown to be a responsible neighbour.

### **Suggested changes to Easemore Road Social Club licence**

- 1) Change licensing hours in an attempt to reduce long periods of being open to prevent high levels of intoxication, suggested hours as follows:**

Sunday:                      From 11:00 to 14:00 then 16:00 to 22:00

Monday to Thursday: From 11:00 to 14:00 then 17:00 to 23:00

Friday to Saturday:    From 10:00 to 14:00 then 16:00 to 23:00

- 2) Restrict times allowed outside of front of club to drink:**

Morning times: 11:00 to 14:00

Evening times 17:00 to 19:00

These times reflect an attempt to deal with reported ASB at this location.

- 3) To use SIA licensed door staff to patrol front, side, rear and car park of premises, to deal with any associated ASB, drug use and drinking on car park. Again this reflects the concern for ASB and criminal activity being reported.**
- 4) To extend CCTV coverage of premises to cover front, side, rear and carpark. Again in an attempt to deal with ASB.**
- 5) For bar staff/management to maintain a clear distinction between being friendly and social with customers and maintaining their roles within a licensed premises.**
