1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1. To consider and determine an application for street trading consent received from Mr Turget Duman, who proposes to trade at a layby on Enfield Industrial Estate Road, Redditch, Worcestershire, B97 6DL.
- **1.2.** Maps and aerial photographs of the proposed trading location can be seen at **Appendix 1**.
- **1.3.** Photographs of the van the applicant proposes to use to carry on street trading activities can be seen at **Appendix 2**.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. On 11 June 2025 an application for the grant of a street trading consent was received from Mr Turget Duman. Mr Duman has applied for a street trading consent to be able to sell kebabs, burgers, chips, and hot and cold drinks (non-alcoholic) from a van at a layby on Enfield Business Park Enfield Industrial Estate Road Redditch Worcestershire B97 6DL
- 2.2. The proposed trading hours are from 16:00 to 23:00, seven days a week.

2.3. In accordance with the Council's Street Trading Policy, the application included all required documentation, was circulated to the relevant responsible authorities, and a public notice was displayed at the proposed location.

3. REPRESENTATIONS

RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

3.1. No objections were received from any of the responsible authorities notified of the application.

OTHER PERSONS

3.2. Two representations were received from other persons with concerns relating to the application. The representations are attached at **Appendix 3**.

4. LOCAL POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- **4.1.** The Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council's Street Trading Policy, which is attached as **Appendix 4**.
- 4.2. Members should have particular regard to the key considerations set out at section 3.7 of the Policy when they are determining this application.

5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1. The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application in accordance with the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. This states that upon receipt of an application for the grant of a street trading consent, the Council may grant a consent if they think fit.
- 5.2. In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is obliged to have regard to the street trading policy adopted by The Council.
- 5.3. The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the representations made and the evidence it hears.
- 5.4. The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate:
 - a) Allow the consent to be granted
 - b) Refuse the application
- 5.5. Paragraph 9 (3) of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 states that a council may require that applications for the grant or renewal of licences or consents shall be accompanied by so much of the fee as the council may require, by way of a deposit to be repaid by the council to the applicant if the application is refused.
- 5.6. All parties to the hearing will be notified of the Sub-Committee's decision in writing within five working days of the conclusion of the hearing.
- 5.7. The Sub-Committee are advised that The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 does not provide any direct right of appeal against a decision to revoke a street trading consent. Therefore a consent holder aggrieved by a decision to revoke a street trading consent, would only be able to challenge that decision by making an application for a judicial review

5.8. The hearing should be conducted in accordance with the agreed procedure.

6. FOR DECISION

6.1. The Sub-Committee must consider whether to grant or refuse the application made by Mr Duman.
