**1. RECOMMENDATIONS**

**2. BACKGROUND**

2.1 This report sets out proposed appointments to outside bodies and seeks nominations accordingly.

**3. OPERATIONAL ISSUES**

3.1 A number of bodies ask the Council to make appointments to them for terms of office which vary from one year upwards.

3.2 Some of these appointments, usually to national or regional bodies, are generally made by office. Where there are specific requirements for appointments these are shown against the organisations in the appendix.

3.3 For ease of reference, the list at Appendix 1 includes all the outside bodies to which appointments are required to be made at the Annual Meeting of Council. There are some additional bodies that have been omitted from the list because the appointment(s) have already been made and no further nominations are needed for 2026/27.

4.1 There are no financial implications.

**5. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 5.1 No specific legislation governs the appointment or nomination of members to outside bodies by the Council. Depending on the nature of the relationship the Council has with the organisation, the legal status of the organisation, its corporate, charity or other status and its constitution, there are differing legal implications for the members sitting on these bodies.
- 5.2 The Local Authorities (Indemnities for Members and Officers) Order 2004 governs the Council's ability to indemnify members sitting on outside bodies

**6. OTHER - IMPLICATIONS**

**Local Government Reorganisation**

- 6.1 It is proposed that vacancies for which an appointment would usually be required for four years should instead be made for two years, to align with the timetable for Local Government Reorganisation.

**Relevant Council Priority**

- 6.2 The action proposed in this report supports the Council priority of supported governance.
- 6.3 It is good practice to consider outside body appointments on an annual basis and for Council to review the outside bodies list, as attached at Appendix 1 to this report.

- 6.5 Members appointed to outside bodies can make a valuable contribution to the local community, including by serving on local Voluntary and Community Sector groups.

- 7.1 There would be risks arising if the Council failed to make appointments to the Outside Bodies listed in this report; the nature of the risk would vary depending on the type of body in question. The Council needs to participate in certain Outside Bodies to ensure that existing governance arrangements can be complied with. On other bodies the risk would be less severe but non-participation would detract from the Council's ability to shape and influence policies and activities which affect the residents of Redditch.
