In 200809 and 200910 the monthly average was 4 per month, rising to 5 in 201011, and again to 7 in 201112, representing an increase over the full time period from 0.8% of the total crime in Redditch to 1.4% ¹
Crimes with domestic abuse interest marker	539	558	581	581	585	562	567	573	<i>Worse</i> than last year, showing an increasing trend. In 200809 the monthly average was 41 rising to 42 in 200910, by 201011 and 201112 the monthly average was 48 per month, representing an increase over the full time period from 8.1% of the total crime in Redditch to 9.6% ¹ .
